Grades: Final course letter grades are given on the standard grading scale:

Grade = (top five quizzes scores) + (4 test scores)

Average 90 - 100% : Grade A; Average 80 - 89%: Grade B; Average 70 - 79%: Grade C; Average 60 - 69%: Grade D; Average 50 - 59%: Grade F. If you attend 90% or more of the lectures, take at least 5 quizzes and all 4 tests, then "No Credit" (NC grade) will be awarded in place of an F. Plus/minus grades will not be assigned.
